

Collier County CoC Racial and Ethnic Disparity Analysis Summary

The following are the results of an analysis of racial and ethnic data for clients enrolled in Collier County CoC programs in HMIS from 10/1/2017 to 9/30/2018

Our community demographics compared to the homeless populations served by all CoC programs shows minorities experiencing homelessness at a greater rate. Our Census demographics indicate 7% of Collier County is black or other minority while 23% plus of the CoC HMIS data shows minorities are experiencing homelessness.

Hispanic populations served by all CoC programs represent 49.6% while non-Hispanic is only 30.2%. The balance, 20.2%, represents the HUD selection of "Not Given".

Populations by Race Served from **All CoC Programs**:

- Black or African Americans served is 23.3% of the homeless population.
- American Indian or Alaskan Natives served is .002% of the homeless population.
- Asians served is .001% of the homeless population.
- Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islanders served is .001% of the homeless population.
- Whites served is 59% of the homeless population.
- The remaining 17.696% represents the HUD selection of "Not Given".

Racial and ethnic disparities in enrollment in **shelter programs**:

- Hispanics make up 43% of those in shelters. They have an 89% success rate to permanent housing exits.
- Non-Hispanics, the remaining 57%, have a slightly higher rate, 91.3%, of success to permanent housing at exit.
- Whites make up 68% of those exiting to permanent destinations while Black or African Americans make up 31% with 1% refusing Race answer.

For non-shelter programs providing **homeless prevention or rapid rehousing** the HMIS data is represented this way:

- Collectively for HP and RRH whites made up 81% of those receiving services while Black African Americans were 19%. There was not any other race demographic reported for this timeframe.
- Collectively for HP and RRH program services Hispanics accounted for 43% for those served.

- RRH return to CoC services year to date, as of August 22, 2019, shows only one returning for additional RRH support services from the previous 12 months reporting period. That one individual was white.

Individually by program type: **Homeless Prevention**

- Minorities make up 17% of those receiving homeless prevention services.
- Hispanics represent 40% of those served by homeless prevention services.

Individually by program type: **Rapid Rehousing**

- Minorities make up 20% of those receiving rapid rehousing services.
- Hispanics represent 49% of served by rapid rehousing services.

The successes coming from inclusion of our rural farming community in the rapid rehousing program are reflected by increase of Hispanics and minorities served over the previous year's evaluation (2015-16).

The Collier County Continuum of Care HMIS reports monthly to the CoC General Membership and Executive Committee on the month to month trends of populations receiving services by types. To date there have not been any developed targeted strategies to address disparities in services provided to racial minorities other than the Federal and State policies on discrimination.

Chart 1 reflects the numbers of persons served as well as served populations demographics. * Our community demographics compared to the homeless populations served by all CoC programs shows minorities experiencing homelessness at a greater rate.
